President's Summary- Christine McLeod Jan 23rd 2019

As always, January has been a busy month for your APE with several activities taking place and being planned. Below is a summary for you and update- so you can feel in the loop

Looking ahead:

Folie en Rouge

- As of 3pm today we have 40 tickets left- WE WILL SELL OUT
- Amazing response from all schools
- We will sell out 300 tickets biggest number ever- should be \$3,000 in ticket revenue minus fees
- Our costs include \$500 for DJ, \$500 for decorations and rental around \$150 for gym rental around \$100 for photocopies and posters and \$375 for MC/Dance/Flash mob party pumper Dance4life BC, around \$150 in lights and effects
- The event will also have estimated revenues of \$600 for concession and \$350 for instax
- Partners that have signed on are Happimess (art installation/activity no charge to us), Ecole Squamish Elementary (running concession, splitting concession \$ with us), Rebecca Amber Photography (doing photobooth) Nesters (Sean giving us 300 waters and pops, chips for free which we are selling)
- Sign up Genius still has holes in it please please please consider signing up (NOT ON THE LIST IS FRIDAY Feb 8th)

3.30pm) and Saturday 10am (text Christine 604.848.9407) and also we need more people to BAKE

- We also need more DADS to join our “security team” and a couple of parents to help Jamie put the dance floor together Friday 3.30pm
- PROFIT from the event we would like to propose going towards supporting the formation of a FRANCOPHONE SOCIETY- see below - and we are proposing \$1500 to put aside and explore how we can best utilize that money towards that goal.



- ACTION NEEDED: more help from Grade 5 parents especially on set up and lead up to the event and baking

La Guerre des Tuques

- Amazing response from parents and teachers alike.
- Goals have been revised and hard to reach- hoping by the end of this week to have at least one class get their tuques
- Teachers and supervisors very grateful to get tuques as well- we gave them a special grey one with a hand written note from APE thanking them for supporting our project
- Goal was to increase spirit, a bit of fun and competitive spirit, support the school in its goals of speaking French and create something we could do annually
- We have spent \$1600 of APE money to date on this

- We have to vote on spending \$300+/- more to take three groups over to Adventure Center for the viewing of the film la Guerre des Tuques early Feb (20 min walk over, movie and 20 min walk back, IN THEIR TUQUES)
- Will ask for \$ from APE to buy each kid a hot chocolate too
- Marie-Eve will submit a summary of this event to Fédération des Parents Francophones de la CB and we will be in their newsletter next month, has also shared with other APEs

Soirée FrancoFun

- We need to hear recommendations from parents and the 6-7 committee on this - for May 2019 are we doing a big \$10,000 fundraising event or a social event>
- What are we fundraising for ?
- Please committee to present to APE in Feb date and location of event as we have no APE meeting in March

RESPECT video

- The APE Spent \$2000 to complete this project, \$1500 in filming and editing and \$500 in production to Pascal Gallant and Christine McLeod - the project took over a year to complete but is now done and there is a plan to use in the classrooms, share with CSF and other schools in Squamish
- Soccer balls purchased for \$85 total for the classes to encourage round circle discussions (example shown demonstrated at APE meeting tonight)

Diversified

- After all the feedback from parents in the fall for Diversified, the final communication in DECEMBER after many requests for follow up was “everything is solved, we have communicated on issues with parents as they arise” so no need to meet in person

- This is a clear missed opportunity and I have let both Michel Tardif and the Diversified Operations team know. Hoping next fall we can invite the bus drivers and buses and team from Diversified to Epluchette de Ble D'inde to answer questions, as well as present to parents clearly what we can do to help THEM on the bus and how to resolve problems or prevent them from escalating
- At this point please email Diversified with any problems and Cc Michel Tardif

Graines de Chefs

- The trial day we had worked well with over 30 kids signed up for two sessions
- APE to vote is this something we would like to see offered at one of our portables and just for our school or offered to ESE French immersion too?
- 45 min programs need 6-8 kids minimum
- Possibility of Thursdays and Fridays
- Start date could be Feb or April - vote needed
- At this point no plans to have them in the class however we can look at putting that in the budget for 2019-2020 school year if we want

Playground

- We have an opportunity to add more structures to the playground
- This is costly and time consuming
- Questions we need to ask
 - How long are we staying here?
 - What else is needed?
 - Who is prepared to fundraise?
 - Who is prepared to lead this

Painting

- Values painted on walkway are fading, we will repaint in the spring when the ground is dry
- We have “épicerie” (grocery store) signs to add to the little houses
- **Do we want to move the house in the back to the front in the spring (Vote needed and parent to take this on needed)**
- \$1600 spent to update lines, values, games painted
- **Request for spring from Catherine Lair to paint lines in parking lot for BBall court/soccer field- to be voted on in Feb**

Strategic Planning

- The APE EXEC will embark on strategic planning in March-April and will need feedback from parents ALL PARENTS on what should the priorities of the APE be in 2019-2020 and beyond.
- Advocacy? Fundraising? Enrollment?
- Please look out for survey in Feb AND COMPLETE IT so the information we get is accurate and represents BOTH parents in each family!
- When we get input from everyone we can make better decisions and planning

Request for update from CSF on a few things

- The APE EXEC is requesting from CSF perhaps to join our Feb meeting and give us updates on
 - Strategic Plan
 - Location of new school- any news, timeframe
 - Funding and/or support for additional portables if needed (here or offsite)- for creation of Grade 8 and/or pre-K

- Also from Michel T- request for plan and proposal for 2019-2020 what are we doing with Grade 6-7 which will be the biggest yet and too big for one class- would there be a 6-7 and a 5-6? This decision may impact current Grade 6 parents deciding to stay or leave so APE Exec would like to see if there is active retention plan- last year we lost SEVEN of our 9 grade 6s.

Notice of motion put forward by some APEs in CSF

- A letter from the APE of André Piolat and signed by several other APEs has been written asking for the resignation of the executive for the CSF. Lack of transparency, accountability and poor communication on a number of issues have been given - you can follow along in the news type in APE Andre Piolat and CSF it will all pop up
- At this point although this APE has had big frustrations with the CSF specifically during the transition to the new school and how that was all handled, we have decided not to add our names to the letter of support but we are waiting to see how this all plays out. Being a school board for the whole province, it is quite different than just the SD48 school board.

NEW ISSUES TO DISCUSS

- Sexual Health education by grade is a ministerial requirement- we have received feedback from Michel that the curriculum at les Aiglons is compliant however as an APE we have put forward for discussion Sexual Health, gender identity, consent and more as possibilities and opportunities to bring speakers in such as Mary Saugstad, Julie Miller and Kristin Trotter . The downside is they are in English

- Options include the APE/School paying for translation and the facilitators teaching the TEACHERS the new curriculum
- Ensuring the teachers are teaching it currently
- Bringing in outside English facilitators and having them cofacilitate with teachers.
- At issue is also whether the APE should be paying for something that is CURRICULUM and required. More to come- stay tuned!

Bullying, rude and mean behaviour

- It seems a fact of every day school life yet still issues come to our attention of rude, mean and bullying behaviour happening at school at recess and on the school bus
- Do we have an opportunity and responsibility as APE Parents to help make this better and if so how can we do this?
- Feb is anti bullying month and Feb 26th is pink shirt day
- We have a few ideas we will propose to parents, perhaps starting with the BUS.
- In the meantime, please remind your children that taking the bus is a privilege and not a right. It is a privilege that can be taken away
- We think there is an opportunity to equip our students with tools to stand up for kids being picked on and stop bullying in its tracks. Too often kids will be bystanders out of fear.
- Reminder that for bullying to be present, three conditions typically exist >
 - A imbalance of power (can be a popular vs unpopukar kid, older kid vs younger kid etc.)
 - Targeted- not general mean behaviour to all, but targeted to one person in particular
 - Repeated: Not a one time rude comment but a repeated physical or emotional assault.
 - Remind your kids of the acronym DIRE they

- use in school (they can tell you what it means)
